History of the University

The spirit, vision and leadership of Horace Mann, America's father of public education and its strongest advocate, lives on more than 180 years after Bridgewater State University first opened its doors for the purpose of training teachers. His belief, not only in the importance of public education, but also in standardizing – or normalizing – the training of teachers, led to the establishment of normal schools. In 1840, Bridgewater became the third such school in the commonwealth and, along with its sister institutions, developed a comprehensive approach to teacher training that became a model emulated throughout the country and across the globe.

Bridgewater Normal School grew as the educational needs of society evolved. Not only were more and better-qualified teachers essential to a healthy and prosperous citizenry, but also the demand for a college-level liberal arts college curriculum required that the Massachusetts General Court expand course offerings at the normal schools and establish public institutions of higher education.

Today, Bridgewater State University is the comprehensive university of Southeastern Massachusetts and the third largest public university – 10th largest overall, public or private – in the commonwealth. With an enrollment of approximately 11,000 students, Bridgewater State University provides a wide range of academic programs and innovative learning experiences inside and outside the classroom. The University grants more than 2,500 degrees and certificates each year.

The University's academic programs (36 undergraduate majors and 80 graduate programs) are housed and administered through its six colleges: the College of Education and Health Sciences; The College of Graduate Studies, the College of Humanities and Social Sciences, the Louis M. Ricciardi College of Business, the Bartlett College of Science and Mathematics; and the College of Continuing Studies.

Despite the transformation of the campus over the past two decades and growth in student population, Bridgewater State University remains committed to small class sizes and extraordinary teaching a mentoring by a world-class faculty. Bridgewater affords students of all ages and backgrounds access to a variety of opportunities for learning and personal growth such as undergraduate research (which is nationally ranked by the Council on Undergraduate Research), international study, service learning and participation in an array of social justice initiatives.

Bridgewater's commitment to student success has earned national recognition (ranked 9th in the nation by The Education Trust for simultaneously closing achievement gaps while improving graduation and retention rates for all students) as the University enjoys a six-year graduation rate just over 60 percent,

well above the national average for its mission class, and a freshman-sophomore retention rate of 77 percent.

These impressive numbers don't end there. Bridgewater graduate students historically have had among the highest first-time CPA exam pass rates of any university in Massachusetts. The University has been named an Apple College of Distinction award winner across the U.S. for its iPad initiative in the College of Education and Health Sciences. All the while, Bridgewater continues as one of the most prolific educators of new preK-12 teachers in the commonwealth and readies more science and mathematics teachers annually than any institution in Massachusetts.

Each year, more than 500 students participate in paid internships offered by the University in collaboration with the Bridgewater State University Foundation; the campus community provides nearly \$1-million in volunteer service to the region; and more than 750 students participate in the University's research symposium as well as many national and regional research conferences.

Bridgewater State University's tradition of providing opportunity – to learn by doing, to serving the world and region, to teaching and learning, to discovering career paths, and dedication to making dreams a reality – have created the thriving, dynamic institution we see today.

First Time Freshmen Admissions Fall 2015 – 2019









Profile of First-Time Freshmen (N=1,611) Fall 2019






Distribution of SAT Scores of First-Time Freshmen (N=1,258) Fall 2019

Math SAT Scores







Average Math Scores




Average ERW Scores




SAT Scores: Comparisons by Sex Fall 2015 – 2019

Average Math SAT Scores




Average ERW SAT Scores





Profile of Transfer Students (N=957) Fall 2019






Total Fall Enrollment Fall 2015 – 2019

Total Enrollment by Headcount and FTE




Total Enrollment by Status

Undergraduate Enrollment by Headcount and FTE




Undergraduate Enrollment by Status




Graduate Fall Enrollment Fall 2015-2019

Graduate Enrollment by Status










Distribution of Undergraduate Credit Loads Fall 2019

Credit Loads of All Undergraduates (Average credit load = 13 credits)




Credit Loads of Matriculated Undergraduates (Average credit load = 13.2 credits)




Distribution of Graduate Credit Loads Fall 2019





First-Time Full-Time First to Second Year Retention Rates by Cohort Year




First-Time Full-Time 4- and 6- Year Graduation Rates by Cohort Year



Profile of Degree Recipients by Program Level 2019

The overwhelming majority of BSU graduates are Massachusetts residents; only 5 percent of degree recipients are from out-of-state. Approximately 29 percent of baccalaureate degree recipients are at least 25 years of age or older; 11 percent are 30 or older. The majority of degree recipients at both the baccalaureate and graduate levels are female (62% and 76% respectively). Eighteen percent of total degree recipients are students of color.





Distribution of Full-Time Faculty by Sex (Tenured or on Tenure-Track) by Rank



Percentage of Full-Time Faculty of Color (Tenured or on Tenure-Track) by Sex, Rank, and Overall



Percentage of Full-Time Faculty (Tenured or on Tenure-Track) with Terminal Degree, by Rank, Sex, and Overall




Age Distribution of Full-Time Faculty Fall 2019

Percentage of Full-Time Faculty (Tenured or on Tenure-Track) By Age




Full-Time Faculty by Years at BSU Fall 2019

Glossary of Terms

Academic Year - Consecutive fall and spring semesters. For example: AY 19-20 refers to the interval from Fall 2019 to Spring 2020.

Accepted - Admitted by the institution.

Census Date - Date on which official enrollment data are extracted from the student information system. This generally occurs in the fourth week of the semester.

Class - Alumni who graduated in a fiscal year (between July 1 in one year and June 30 in the next year). For example, a student graduating between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019 belongs to the class of '19.

Cohort - All students who entered the institution at the same time; usually designated by matriculation year.

Cumulative GPA - The grade point average calculated on all work completed at BSU.

Enrolled - Registered at time of semester census date.

First-Time Freshmen - Freshmen attending any college for the first time, including those with Advanced Placement credit and those who have earned college credits prior to high school graduation and/or during summer session between high school and college matriculation.

First Generation Student - A student for whom the highest educational level of both parents/guardians is less than a four-year degree.

Fiscal Year - Funding year that includes July 1 through June 30. For example: FY 2020 refers to the fiscal year from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

Freshman - An enrolled student with fewer than 24 accumulated credit hours.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment - Full-time equivalent enrollment is based on the following formula: <u>Undergraduate FTE</u>=semester credit hours/15; <u>Graduate FTE</u>=semester credit hours/12.

Full-Time Equivalent Faculty - Each full-time faculty member is counted as one FTE; however, adjustments are made for alternative responsibilities. For part-time faculty, FTE faculty = (total credit hours)/15.

Full-Time Faculty/Staff - Faculty/staff employed 100% time; faculty on annual sabbatical leave not included.

Full-Time Student - <u>Undergraduates:</u> Students registered for 12 or more credit hours at the census date; <u>Graduate Students:</u> Students registered for 9 or more credit hours at the census date.

Graduate Division - Courses numbered 500 and above.

Gross Square Feet (GSF) - The sum of all areas on all floors of a building included within the outside faces of its exterior walls, including floor penetration areas, however insignificant, for circulation and shaft areas that connect one floor to another.

Junior - An enrolled student with 54.0 - 83.5 accumulated credit hours.

Low Income Student – A student who is eligible for federal Pell grants.

Lower Division - Courses numbered 000 to 299.

Matriculated - Enrolled in a degree program.

Monograph - A separate treatise on a single subject or class of subjects or on one person, usually detailed in treatment but not extensive in scope and often containing bibliographies.

Need-Based Financial Aid - Aid in the form of scholarships, grants, loans, and student employment awarded to students on the basis of demonstrated financial need.

Net Assignable Square Feet (NASF) - The sum of all areas on all floors of a building assigned to, or available for assignment to, an occupant or specific use.

Non-Matriculated - Not enrolled in a degree program.

Non-Need Based Financial Aid - Aid in the form of scholarships, grants, loans, and student employment not based on demonstrated financial need.

Non-Resident - A student paying out-of-state tuition.

Net Square Feet (NSF) - The sum of all areas on all floors of a building assigned to, or available for assignment to, an occupant or specific use, or necessary for the general operation of a building.

Part-Time Student - <u>Undergraduates:</u> Students registered for fewer than 12 credit hours at the census date; <u>Graduate Students:</u> Students registered for fewer than 9 credit hours at the census date.

Residency - Either in-state or out-of-state, determined for tuition purposes.

Resident - A student paying in-state tuition.

Retention Rate - The percentage of students enrolled from fall semester to fall semester.

SAT Score - Scholastic Aptitude Test score.

Senior - An enrolled student with at least 84 accumulated credit hours.

Serial - Any publication issued in successive parts appearing at intervals--usually regular ones--and as a rule intended to be continued indefinitely. The term includes periodicals, newspapers, annuals, numbered monographic series, and the proceedings, transactions, and memoirs of societies.

Sophomore - An enrolled student with 24.0 - 53.5 accumulated credit hours.

Staff - Non-faculty appointments including executive, professional secretarial/clerical positions, technical/paraprofessional positions, skilled crafts, and service maintenance positions.

Student/Faculty Ratio - The ratio of student FTE to faculty FTE.

Student Credit Hour (SCH) - The sum of credits attempted by students enrolled in a course as of the census date.

Student Level - An indication of a student's progress toward a degree: freshman, sophomore, junior, senior, unclassified.

Student of Color – A student who identifies himself/herself as Hispanic or Latino, American Indian or Alaska Native, Black or African American, Asian, Cape Verdean, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, or two or more races. Excluded are international students of color.

Titles - The number of bibliographic records in the library's on-line catalog.

Transfer Student - A student who earned 12 or more credits at another higher education institution prior to enrolling at BSU.

Unclassified - A non-degree seeking student who cannot be classified into a student level because he or she is not pursuing a degree.

Undeclared - A student who has not specified a major program.

Upper Division - Courses numbered 300-499.

Volumes - The number of item records in the library's on-line catalog.



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
